

The symbol in the upper left corner expresses by means of candle and messianic rose the worship of the Messiah and the Truth of Christ. The cross signifies His central deed and the five crosses in the rose the sacred wounds.

Truth and Hope

This can be a tough time of year. In the winter, days are short, illness is common, some of us face difficult anniversaries without loved ones, and most of us know of — and feel inadequate to help — someone who is suffering. Winter, and especially Lent, remind us of our mortality and sinfulness, of the passage of time, and the fallenness of Creation. It is right that we should mourn these things, and that we grieve the loss of loved ones and of other good gifts of God. We shouldn't be afraid to cry out to God in lament. It's not bad to be sad. Many of the psalms in the Bible, like Psalm 130, are songs of lament.

One of the great things about the church is that we are a community. We bear one another's burdens and share one another's joys. There is no such thing as a Lone Ranger Christian. One of the fundamental marks of Jesus' disciples is our habit of gathering each week to worship God, to hear God's Word, to share in our Lord's Supper, to confess our sins and receive God's forgiveness, to be reminded of and re-oriented to what is true and important, to share our concerns and our reasons for celebration, and to give and receive encouragement.

In a fallen world, at a difficult time, it is easy to lose hope. But part of God's mission in the world is to sustain and strengthen hope, and to carry it into hopeless places. Jesus' incarnation – his life, death, resurrection, and

ascension – gives us reason for hope, even as we face difficult truths about ourselves and our world.

From March 10 and April 14, Paul Rorem will present St. Augustine's famous *Confessions*, one of his teaching emphases at Princeton Theological Seminary. The second session will feature discussion of the memoir sections read (or not), and then go into his more introspective and theological reflections (Book X), especially the part Luther liked. CALL FOR CANDIDATES FOR THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Congregational Voters Meeting is coming up in May. At this meeting, members of the congregation will elect church officers.

Trish Oelrich and Justin Hylden are stepping down from the Executive Board as Financial Secretary and Vice President/Secretary, respectively. The Executive Board is grateful for their dedicated service on behalf of the congregation.

At present, we have no candidates for these two positions. The responsibilities are described in Messiah's Constitution as follows:

The Vice President and Secretary

- Shall assist the President in the performance of his duties, and shall perform the duties of the president in the latter's absence or inability to act.
- Shall keep accurate minutes of all Congregational and Executive Board meetings and shall keep a register of attendance at each meeting.

The Financial Secretary


- Shall keep an accurate record of all envelope offerings and submit quarterly statements to the contributors.
- Shall supervise a distribution before the beginning of the year of contribution envelops to communicant members and contributors.
- Shall be responsible for recording all monies received by the congregation.

In addition, Executive Board members participate in Executive Board meetings (held monthly or every other month) and the Voter's Meetings, held twice annually in May and December.

Trish Oelrich will train the new Financial Secretary in Church 360 software and the necessary financial procedures.
