

#### Why the Lectionary?

People occasionally ask me why Messiah uses the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) as the source for our Sunday scripture readings. In the August 2019 issue of *Forum Letter*, a monthly publication of the American Lutheran Publicity Bureau, Pastor Richard O. Johnson makes a seven point case for using the RCL. I won't repeat all seven points here, but here are a few important ones:

- 1. A standard lectionary unites congregations that use it. It's something we have in common, and reminds us that we are part of a common mission God's to his fallen but beloved world. In feeding us the same Word that our sisters and brothers in other congregations are receiving on the same day, a common lectionary builds unity and a shared sense of purpose and priorities among us.
- 2. The RCL was created by a large number of scholars with interest and expertise in different parts of the Bible. As a result, it includes passages from a range of biblical sources, including difficult passages. The RCL ensures that we receive a rich, varied, challenging, and encouraging diet of God's Word.
- 3. Reading and preaching from a lectionary keeps us disciplined. As with many things in life, we get tired of it. Persevering through the lectionary anyway is good practice for persevering with what is good in other areas of life, even when the novelty has worn off and it no longer excites us.
- 4. The RCL helps us to pattern our lives according to the liturgical year. Many of the readings are seasonal and form our sense of time around the festivals of the church.

5. The RCL provides a variety of readings each Sunday through which God speaks to us, in addition to the sermon. Pastors are, or should be, acutely aware that congregations include people with a variety of needs, and that no one sermon can address them all. Having several readings widens the scope of the Word we hear on a given day, addressing a greater range of questions and needs.

I can testify from personal experience to the truth of several of Pastor Johnson's points. When, before I was a pastor, I lived for a summer in Gardiner, Montana, there was no Lutheran congregation in or near town. But at local congregations that used a lectionary, I could at least be assured of hearing four substantial, varied passages of scripture in the Sunday worship service.

Hearing from four different parts of scripture each week (typically, Old Testament, Psalm, New Testament Epistle, and Gospel) helps us to hear the whole counsel of God in scripture, and to develop and reinforce a coherent, nuanced, and multi-faceted biblical theology that is at once challenging and refreshing. There is rejoicing and lament, Law and Gospel, history and poetry, comfort and exhortation. The RCL keeps us from becoming lazy, clinging to our hobbyhorses, and pushes us into the depth and variety of God's Word, so we grow up into maturity.

There is no perfect way to select Sunday scripture readings. Every one has pros and cons, but some are better than others. The RCL is a gift to the church, and despite its drawbacks, I'm grateful for it. If there is a part of scripture that the RCL omits that you'd like to hear more from, please let me know. I may be able to include it in worship services or adult education. The lectionary is not a straitjacket, but provides structure and variety that we would otherwise miss. Thanks be to God for the gift of his Word!




