

What's the Good of Being Christian?

I can tell when I've walked into a confused church when, on Easter Sunday, the pastor proclaims, "The resurrection of Jesus points us to something greater!" "Like what?", I wonder.

These last two months, the Adult Forum has been reading *The Screwtape Letters*, by C.S. Lewis. First published in England in 1942, during the Second World War, *The Screwtape Letters* is a series of letters Lewis imagines a senior devil, Screwtape, writing to a junior devil, Wormwood, advising him on how to ruin a person's soul. Lewis uses this literary device to reveal the subtle ways in which the devil and his minions tempt, distract, and confuse us.

In one letter, Screwtape writes to Wormwood, "I had not forgotten my promise to consider whether we should make the patient an extreme patriot or an extreme pacifist. ... Whichever he adopts, your main task will be the same. Let him begin by treating the Patriotism or the Pacifism as a part of his religion. Then let him, under the influence of partisan spirit, come to regard it as the most important part. Then quietly and gradually nurse him on to the stage at which the religion becomes merely part of the 'cause', in which Christianity is valued chiefly because of the excellent arguments it can produce in favour of the British war-effort or of Pacifism. ... Once you have made the World an end, and faith a means, you have almost won your man, and it makes very little difference what kind of worldly end he is pursuing. Provided that meetings, pamphlets, policies, movements, causes, and crusades, matter more to him than prayers and sacraments and charity, he is ours — and the more 'religious' (on those terms) the more securely ours. I could show you a pretty cageful down here."

These are the words of a professional tempter. It's easy for us to fall into the trap of treating Christian faith and faithfulness as means to a higher end, when in fact they are the ends that give meaning and value to all others. When we begin thinking of our faith as a stepping stone to higher things — patriotism, pacificism, social justice, happiness, hygge, economic growth, safety, climate control, biodiversity, simplicity, efficiency, literacy, or longevity — we've fallen into that trap. Screwtape would be delighted. None of those things is bad *per se*. Many of them are highly desirable, difficult to attain, and worthy of our effort. But they are goods subordinate to our living in humble, joyful obedience and gratitude to God. (*continued on next page*)

God frees us to live as good gifts to our neighbors. God's sacrificial love for us increases our elation at Easter as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection, in which we now share through Baptism. There is no better news or higher end.
