

Steadfast and Adaptable

Nine Septembers ago I was installed as Messiah's pastor at a service where my friend and fellow pastor, the Rev. Paul Sauer, preached in part on this verse from the Gospel of Matthew:

"And [Jesus] said to them, "Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house, who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old" (Matthew 13:52).

What a blessing Messiah has been to me since then, and I hope the feeling is mutual! I feel fortunate to have been called to a congregation that seems like such a good fit.

We read Matthew 13:52 again recently on the Eighth Sunday after Pentecost (this year, it fell on July 26), and I was reminded then of how important it is for congregations and their pastors to bring from their treasure what is new and what is old. We need to be deeply rooted, steadfast, and committed to our faith, refusing to be distracted from it, and at the same time humble, adaptable, and creative in bringing our faith to bear in new situations. It's not one or the other. It's both. Which is a tall order.

But it's a good order! It stretches us and keeps us faithful without letting us get complacent. I have been impressed with Messiah as we navigate Covid together — remaining steadfast in essentials while adapting to this new situation. It hasn't been easy, but it's been good. We're continuing to worship, to learn, and to have fellowship with one another; to support one another in times of grief and discouragement, to encourage one another in patience and perseverance, and to cherish one another as precious, worthwhile sisters and brothers in Christ. Covid continues to try us, but, to quote Job, "But he knows the way that I take; when he has tried me, I shall come out as gold" (Job 23:10).

Covid and its attendant stress try both the steadfastness and the adaptability of our faith. But by the power and the fruit of the Holy Spirit, we're making it! We're coming through, and the gold has begun to shine!

And for the time being, we'll endure what we must and thank God for what we can. How blessed we are to be able to gather online as well as in person! That's relatively new. How blessed we are to stand on the firm foundation of God's Word, and to rest in the steadfast love and mercy He has shown his people from of old.
