

Also new this year is that we won't have a weekday Thanksgiving service at Messiah. In the past, the service has been on Wednesday evening of Thanksgiving week, and sparsely attended. This year, we will integrate Thanksgiving themes into our Christ the King service on Sunday, November 20, and publish information about other weekday Thanksgiving services in the vicinity (see p. 6).

We also look forward to becoming better stewards of money, energy, and natural resources following the renovation of electrical fixtures in the church building, from lighting to HVAC equipment. A project timeline has not yet been set, but we expect to have the work done in the next few months.

Finally, we look forward to the imminent launch of our new church website. Messiah's current website was designed in 2008 and it's time for an update. Get your seasonal flu shot now, available at most pharmacies. In addition to protecting you, vaccines protect vulnerable people around you for whom infection could cause serious illness. The cost of the shot is covered by most health insurance plans. If you're paying out of pocket, the Costco and Sam's Club pharmacies both offer the basic version of the shot for less than \$20, and their pharmacies are open to non-members.

Christmas is my favorite holiday, and my favorite tradition is decorating the tree. My whole family comes home for the




holidays, and we always put aside a night to decorate the tree and watch a Christmas movie.


How did you start attending the Lutheran Church of the Messiah?


