

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Will and Thy Will

Writing this in the second week of August, I'm struck, as I often am at this time of year, by how little summer is left before we return to our school-year schedule at Messiah. Whatever the season, urgent tasks compete with important ones for our attention. We often move things that don't need to be done immediately to the back burner and leave them there. Meanwhile, time marches on.



With our future in God's hands, we need not fear the passage of time. God's gift of eternal life frees us from frenzied exploitation of all the world has to offer lest we miss out on something before we die. Instead, we cherish the time and other resources God has given us – holding them gently and trying to manage them well.

LANDSCAPING UPDATE



More Landscaping Improvements in the Future for Messiah

The summer weather has been kind to Messiah's new trees and shrubs. The day after they were planted, it poured, and it continued to rain hard every two or three days for about a month, long enough for the trees to get adjusted to their new home and start to grow. The shrubs, which were planted before the trees, have really taken off, and now are awaiting a haircut to keep their growth nice and dense. The trees will continue to need TLC for some time, but Charlie Peterson of Peter-

son's Nursery checked them out about two weeks ago and pronounced them healthy and hearty.

Mr. Peterson was at Messiah scoping out the lay of the land for two new shrub and flower areas to be planted in the fall and spring. A triangular flower and shrub bed is being planned for the corner of Nassau St. and Cedar Lane, possibly featuring a ribbon of mixed daffodils and day lilies, as well as some ornamental evergreens and a dwarf Japanese Maple reaching a maximum height of 3-4 feet. A larger bed on the slope between the sidewalk and the church walk on the side of the building will feature shade-tolerant plants like heucheras, hostas, astilbes, hydrangeas, and ferns.

Heucheras (also known as coral bells for their flowers) and hostas (with the rather unattractive alternative moniker of funkia) come in a dazzling array of colors which will brighten up that area. Heuchera have leaves of yellow, chartreuse, green, pink, peach, burgundy, red, and green and white veined, depending on the variety. Astilbes have delicate fern-like foliage and wonderful spires of fluffy flowers in whites, pinks, purples, and reds.

Meanwhile, Saturday, October 26, has been designated Messiah Fall Work Day. Mark your calendars and plan to come help plant bulbs for an even more beautiful display this coming spring, along with weeding (alas, always necessary; five minutes after being weeded, the flowerbeds will have new weeds springing up!) and pruning. I hope you can make it!

We have been fortunate to receive donations for the landscaping, which have allowed us to widen the scope of our plantings. Many people have helped with weeding, planting,

THANK YOU! pruning, and maintenance over the year, which is vital, because it is really quite alarming how quickly weeds and shrubs can grow out of bounds without regular grooming! Thanks as well to those who have helped out by sharing ideas, impressions, and kind words!
