

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

# A Pattern for Worship

Christ is risen! It's great to be alive in that confidence! Alleluia (Praise the Lord)!

Every three years on the third Sunday of Easter, we hear the story from Luke 24 of Jesus joining two of his disciples on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus. It's a favorite of mine for lots of reasons. One of them is that it is a model of how we, like those early disciples, continue to encounter God today in worship. Pastor Dan Whitener of Abiding Presence Lutheran Church in Ewing



pointed this out to me recently: in the Emmaus story, the disciples 1) meet Jesus, 2) wrestle with what they're going through in the light of God's Word, 3) share a meal together, and, having met Jesus, 4) go out from there to tell others what happened to them and figure out what difference it makes.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK (CONT'D)

Meeting, Word, Meal, and Witness – that's a simple way to think of what we do each week in worship. Sunday worship is not private, it's corporate. It requires meeting. We meet on the first day of the week after the pattern of the disciples who, as attested to in every biblical Gospel, encountered Jesus, risen, on that day. We meet to hear God's Word, to see what's going on in our lives in its light, and to have it explained to us in ways that make sense of our experience. We share a meal, the Lord's Supper, instituted and commanded by Jesus. And we go out as witnesses of what we have seen and heard.

We don't have to have it all figured out before we walk out the door. There's plenty of room for us to work out what God's Word means for us outside the service. We have to start somewhere, and we learn as we go. As the apostle Paul wrote to early disciples of Jesus in Corinth, "For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known" (1 Cor. 13:12, ESV). God goes with us, and has poured into us his Holy Spirit to bear witness to Jesus in ways we don't fully understand and of which we're often unaware.

The presence of the Holy Spirit gives us confidence to go out and be witnesses despite our lack of perfect knowledge, rhetoric, or coherence. The Spirit's presence also means we don't have to make our witness more impressive by lacquering it with irresponsible claims. Witness is best when it's honest. God uses that kind of witness. We don't have to invent sensational stories to impress people with God. Neither ought we assume that we should only proclaim what we think we fully understand. Truth is already stranger than fiction; God doesn't need us to gild or redact it. That frees us to trust God to use our witness, despite its imperfection.

Christian witness is not merely *ours*. It has specific content and a well-defined pattern. We witnesses need to keep meeting together, to stay engaged with God's Word, to share the Lord's Supper regularly and frequently, and to demonstrate the difference our encounter with God makes. In Luke's account of what happened on the Emmaus road, we have a pattern for worship that leads to witness. Let's make a habit of it!

### SUNDAY SCHOOL UPDATE

Sunday School students spent the last two months immersed in the Gospels, learning about the meaning and practices of Lent and Holy Week. We made paper palms for Palm Sunday, delved into the Seder practices that would have been featured at the Last Supper, and then after the excitement of Easter, read about Jesus visiting his followers after his resurrection.

The students always enjoy science experiments, so there have been several involving water when we are learning about Baptism, and a snazzy trick

Jonah, the students made whales and Jonahs with clay and painted them bright colors. Deep purple and turquoise whales are so much more interesting than just plain gray, after all.

Just three or four sessions remain before the summer break. Some more Gospel passages and an Old Testament story or two will round out the year. It has been a wonderful experience for the teachers, and a privilege - the children are so eager, so imaginative, and so responsive.

The Easter Egg hunt was a huge success! All the children and their parents gathered downstairs in the Fellowship Hall first to decorate colored shopping bags with stickers and crayons. It was inspiring to see the variety of artistic ideas - no two bags were remotely alike!

All this creative energy was fueled by croissants, muffins, danishes, and some very tasty fruit pastries. The teachers were sure beforehand that too much food had been bought, and that we would be feasting on leftovers for weeks to come. Happily, we were wrong. Making art evidently requires lots of food!

Members of the confirmation class did a brilliant job hiding the chocolate-filled Easter eggs for the younger children to find. Some of the eggs were in easy spots, some in places of medium difficulty, and just a very few in fiendishly difficult locations. All of them were found, although the eggs placed on the window sills high above the ground had to be retrieved with parental assistance! When the dust had settled, each of the children had found plenty of eggs (we had extra on hand just in case some children came up short). Everyone had a good time, children, adults and Sunday School teachers!
