

#### We're Back!

September has arrived, the weather is cooling off, school is starting, and activities at Messiah are picking up! Messiah's Mantles (prayer shawl group), Men's Forum, Sunday School, Adult Forum, ISI (international student ministry supported by Messiah), and Lutheran Campus Ministry will all resume or continue meeting this month. This year, Lutheran Campus Ministry will host monthly dinner discussions rather than offer weekly Taize-style Evening Prayer services. I look forward to the discussions, the fall schedule for which you can find in the Sunday bulletin and in later pages of this newsletter.

As of August 26, we have a new office assistant, Valerie Johnson, who has introduced herself to you by email. One of Valerie's first projects was to publish this newsletter. Welcome, Valerie!

In other news, Messiah is still without a tenant in the parish building. Our realtor continues to show the property, and we look forward to welcoming a new tenant eventually. Zoning code restricts the kind of tenant we can have to a non-profit educational or philanthropic organization. If you know of potential tenants, please tell Miranda Hempel. In the meantime, we have a window of opportunity to upgrade some of the electrical fixtures in the building, taking advantage of an energy conservation incentive from PSE&G. This will involve replacing the parish building HVAC unit and lighting throughout the building with more efficient models. We'll keep the congregation posted about the progress of this project.

In the year leading up to the anniversary, there will be several commemorative events in Princeton sponsored by Princeton Theological Seminary and the New Jersey District of the LCMS. Because one of these events will be scheduled on Oct. 30 (Reformation Sunday), we will have our joint Reformation Sunday Festival Service of Holy Communion the following Sunday, Nov. 6, at 4:00pm, at Bethany Lutheran Church, 1125 Parkside Ave, in Ewing. A potluck will follow the service.

I look forward to joining you for these activities as we live as ambassadors for Christ in God's mission to His world (2 Corinthians 5:16-21).



#### We're Getting Greener!

We're getting greener! Thanks to an energy conservation incentive offered by PSE&G, Messiah's having the parish building HVAC unit and much of the lighting on the church property replaced with more energy efficient models. With a subsidy from PSE&G, Messiah's cost of \$8700 (\$242/month for 36)



months) will be less than the replacement cost of our aging HVAC unit, which is expensive to repair. The money will come from Messiah's Building Reserve Fund, so will not affect our operating budget. Contributions toward the cost of this project are welcome. In addition, we'll get new, more efficient lights that will, we hope, make us better stewards of energy and financial resources. Doing this work now has the benefits of a) not disrupting a tenant, and b) mild outdoor temperatures conducive to being without heat or air conditioning for a few days. We expect the work to be done in the coming weeks and will keep the congregation posted on its progress.




Roger Tabris flying high as he makes an epic jump while playing Bible Name Hopscotch.
