

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Anxiety and Thanksgiving

I love Thanksgiving. One of the things I cherish most about American culture is our tradition of giving thanks, even before we had a national holiday for it. Gratitude is and has long been an essential part of Christian culture too. The Bible not only encourages us to give thanks, but it gives us reason for thanks, opening our eyes to the ways God has blessed us. Even books like Judges that recount grim, gory, and chaotic times make us grateful for the goods we often take for granted, even when they are imperfect – things like peace, food, shelter, potable water, soap, a functioning legal system, anesthetics, people caring for one another, and widely shared belief in human dignity.

Of all the people who have ever lived, it would seem that we have the least to worry about. Why is it then that we're often anxious? For one thing, as standards rise, our expectations tend to rise with them. The possibility of not meeting expectations can be nerve-racking. For another, man does not live by bread alone. Even in the midst of material abundance, we may be anxious about our



spiritual, social, or emotional needs going unmet, or about not meeting those of others. There are always more needs than we can fulfill, and that may make us anxious. Abundance itself can induce anxiety when it presents us with more decisions to make – anxiety often increases with increasing levels of choice and responsibility.

Anxiety and Thanksgiving

Giving thanks is a wonderful antidote to anxiety, and hearing God's Word makes us grateful. On this 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's *95 Theses*, I'm especially grateful that Luther's Theses paved the way for reforms like a) Bible translation and accessibility, b) preaching the good news that God loves us unconditionally and makes us lovable, and c) realizing that through Holy Baptism, God tethers us and our destiny to that of his crucified and resurrected Son, Jesus Christ.

We belong to God. Our life and future have not been ruined by our sin. Each day is a new opportunity to thank God instead of worrying about ourselves. These refreshing biblical truths free us from much of the worry that infests our world. Things in our fallen world are far from perfect, but that doesn't need to make us anxious or afraid. "The earth is the LORD's and everything in it," says Psalm 24:1. We can cast our cares on him (1 Peter 5:7a) and throw ourselves into caring for one another.

Our world needs that good news in the 21^{st} century as badly as it ever has, and we get to be the ones to spread it. Thanks be to God!



Celtic Missions to Anglo-Saxon Britain: July 10 - 18, 2018

From Dublin to Whitby, follow in the footsteps of Irish missionaries to Britain after the Romans left in the 5th century. This tour will include the Book of Kells at Trinity College (Dublin), the site of the 6th century monastery of Glendalough, the Boyne Valley, Armagh, Belfast, Whithorn, Hadrian's Wall, Lindisfarne, Bede's monastery at Wearmouth-Jarrow, Durham, Whitby, and York. We will stay in a total of four hotels, so won't need to pack and move every day.

https://www.tours-international.com/tours-for-individuals/celtic-missions-to-anglo-saxon-britain and use the password **Hilda-664**. For registration by January 31, the cost is £1504 (roughly \$2000 at current exchange rates), and includes local transportation, accommodation, and most meals.

The tour company is located in the UK, so be aware of foreign transaction fees assessed by your credit card issuer. Pastor Erhardt plans to accompany the trip, but to make it happen the tour company needs to see sufficient interest by January 31, 2018. The trip will be publicized in other congregations, so it won't just be people from Messiah. All are welcome - feel free



to publicize the trip and to invite other cheerful, flexible, and interested travelers. Questions? Ask Pastor Erhardt.
